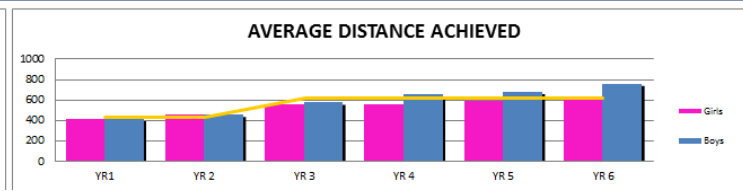
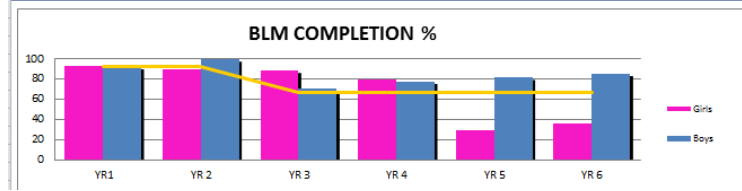
The table below shows a summary of the results from the National Child measurement programme. These results are based, where possible, on the 2013/14, 2014/15 and 2015/16 years combined to give a sample large enough to produce reliable estimates of overweight and obesity at Hanbury's Farm.

The proportion of Reception children who were overweight or obese (25.3%) is statistically similar compared to other schools across England (22%). 23% of Reception children were overweight or obese in Staffordshire local authority. The proportion of Year 6 children who were overweight or obese (44.6%) is statistically similar compared to other schools across England (34%). 33% of Year 6 children were overweight or obese in Staffordshire local authority.
